I have spent the last couple of days meeting with our AAH Committee core group discussing our next steps. We had a very successful April 21st monthly meeting with a big "virtual" turnout! I even invited the Tampa Chapter to join and several of them were able to! It gave us the confidence that we can keep our original calendar schedule but will need to modify the large events. That's the good news! The bad news is that our fund raising efforts are abysmal.. The COVID outbreak hit at the worst time (when we were about to send out our solicitation for premier partners). Moving forward we feel that it is going to be difficult to ask for the full 2.5k donation for the AIA premier partnership without any events on the schedule.
